VIIth Congress of the IEA

The VIIth Congress of the International Ergonomics Association was held in Warsaw, on the 27-30 August, 1979. It was the first IEA Congress held in an Eastern European country. This enabled an important participation from European socialist countries as there were no currency problems so difficult to overcome for journeys to the Western countries.

1. Participation

The overall number of 577 participants from 28 countries represented the highest participation rate achieved so far at an IEA Congress.

2. Programme

/ The scientific programme of the Congress was organized as follows:

- A. Four plenary sessions devoted to the following topics:
 - Ergonomics as a Factor of Socio-Economic Development,
 - The Need for Broadening the Scientific Basis of Ergonomics,
 - Ergonomics of Non-vocational Activities,
 - Ergonomics for Occupational and Public Health Surveys.
- B. Six round table sessions dealing with:
 - Pioneers of Ergonomics,
 - Ergonomics in the Design of Industrial Equipment,
 - Factors influencing the Implementation of Ergonomic Principles in Industrial Practice,
 - Ergonomics and Standarization,
 - Forestry and Agriculture Ergonomics,
 - Application of Ergonomics at Successive Stages of Plant Design.

In addition, a panel discussion was held on "Ergonomics in an Industrial Enterprise - the Experience of Philips Eindhoven".

C. Technical and Poster sessions to discuss communications.

Out of the 207 communications accepted by the Organizing Committee, about 185 have been presented to the Congress. Half of them /ca.90/ were presented at poster sessions which were introduced for the first time at an IEA Congress; they were generally considered to be a considerable success.

The technical and poster sessions were presented in the following 16 groups:

- 1. Past, present and future development of ergonomics
- 2. Anthropometry, biomechanics and body posture
- 3. Physical workload and climatic load
- 4. Experimental psychology and psychophysiology
- 5. Mental load: laboratory investigations
- 6. Mental load: field studies
- 7. Visual and inspection tasks
- 8. Ergonomics in occupational health and safety
- 9. Night and shift work

- 10. Ergonomics for the elderly and the handicapped
- 11. Ergonomic design and evaluation of equipment and products-
- 12. Sectorial applications of ergonomics
- 13. Ergonomics in driving and transport
- 14. Work systems analysis and design
- 15. Ergonomics and the organization of work
- 16. Education and training in ergonomics and human factors

The full texts of seven /out of a total of eight/ invited papers and of three /out of five/ introductions to the round table sessions as well as abstracts of the 207 communications were published in a special issue of "Ergonomics" /nr 6, June 1979/.

Five professional visits were organised on the days following the Congress:

- Warsaw: Central Institute of Labour Protection and Institute of Industrial Design.
- Neighbourhood of Warsaw: Research Institute of Forestry and Institute of Agriculture.
- Łódź: Institute of Industrial Medicine, two textile factories and Museum of History of Textile.
- Kraków: Visit of Kraków, Lenin Steelworks, Academy of Fine Arts, one-day stay in the sanatorium for the staff of the Lenin Steelworks in Krynica.
- Katowice and neighbourhood: Central Institute of Mining, experimental coalmine, Rehabilitation Centre of Repty.

Groups of 10 to 60 persons took part in these excursions.

A visit of Warsaw as well as a ladies' programme was organised for the participants and the accompanying persons.

A cocktail, a reception offered by the Polish Ergonomics Society as well as a farewell party completed the programme of the Congress.

3. Organisation

The VIIth IEA Congress was organised by the Polish Ergonomics Society. The preparatory work was carried out by an Organizing Committee of 14 persons:

This Committee started its work in March 1977, i.e. about two and a half years before the opening of the Congress. The Committee benefitted of a very effective advice and assistance of three representatives of the IEA:

Professor B.Metz /scientific programme/

Dr.R.G.Sell and Professor H.Scholz /organisational and financial problems/.

The IEA advisers visited Warsaw twice in 1977 and 1978 for detailed discussions of the preparatory work.

There was an Honorary Committee presided by the President of the Polish Academy od Sciences, Professor W.Nowacki.

The Congress was held under the high patronage of the President of the Council of State, Professor H.Jabłoński.

On the occasion of the Congress, a medal in bronze as well as a special postage stamp were issued to commemorate Professor Wojciech Jastrzębowski from Warsaw who in 1857 published in a Polish review a study: "Rys ergonomii czyli nauki o pracy" / "Outline of Ergonomics or the Science of Work" / thus coining for the first time in Europe the term of "ergonomics".

Finally, for the benefit of the Congress participants, the Polish Ergonomics Society issued a publication /in Polish and in English/: "Ergonomics in Poland" presenting the history, development and present organisation of ergonomics in Poland.

4. Finance

According to the rules, 50% of the surplus, i.e. $7\ 268,50\ zl=228,50\$ has been transferred to the IEA.

In addition, a surplus of 69 600 zł has been achieved resulting from subventions by Polish institutions to the Organizing Committee. Out of it, 50%, i.e. 34 800 zł /ca. 1 160 \$/ is at the disposal of the IEA though - according to the Polish currency regulations - it is not transferable abroad. This sum will be used for paying travel expenses abroad of the President of the IEA and similar expenses.

Thus, the net income of the IEA resulting from the VIIth Congress is the Tollowing:

50% of transferable surplus \$ 228,50 50% of non transferable surplus \$ 1 160.-
