If the new articles are accepted, the Federated ergonomics societies may designate for the second part of the General Assembly 1967 from among their members delegates according to the following schedule (article 5):

<b>300 - 399</b> members 8	delegates
400 - 799 members 10	delegates
800 and more members 12	delegates

I beg you therefore to send me before 31st August, 1967, two lists with the names of the delegates of your Society for the two parts of the General Assembly 1967.

May I add here that in this second part the corresponding I.E.A. members (presently 128) will have the right of nominating six delegates.
