Dear Professor Grandjean:

I thank you very kindly for your personal support and the opportunity to incorporate engineers within Article 2 of the proposed new articles. As you requested I have re-phrased Article 2 as follows:

Article 2

The International Ergonomics Association is intended to bring together organizations and persons interested in applying the knowledge and approaches of experimental psychology, anatomy, physiology, and engineering to the problems of human work and its environment. It shall establish international contacts among those specializing in this field, promote the knowledge of these sciences on an international level, co-operate with employers' associations and trade unions in order to encourage the practical application of ergonomic sciences in industries, and promote scientific research by qualified persons in this field.

It now appears that I will be attending the Congress in Birmingham. I would welcome the opportunity of discussing my proposal with you further. On behalf of the American Institute of Industrial Engineers, I would also like to seek your views concerning relationships which the I.E.A. has or is establishing within the U.S.A. As I mentioned in my last letter, we hope to have a Human Factors Division within the A.I.I.E. shortly and I believe it would be desirable for I.E.A. and A.I.I.E. to have a good working relationship.
