I hope the various activities of the IEA Visual Ergonomics Technical Committee (VE TC) this year were helpful and beneficial to you.



Dr. Jennifer Veitch, a researcher at the National Research Council of Canada, has been appointed President-Elect of the Commission Internationale de l'Eclairage (CIE). She will serve in this role for the next two years, and as the President of the CIE from 2023-2027.

The CIE is a international scientific union with 40 member countries and an international standards development organization. It is dedicated to advancing the science, technology,

and art of light and lighting, encompassing the full range of related topics including scientific fundamentals such as vision, colour, the metrology of optical radiation, photobiology, photochemistry, as well as lighting applications indoors, outdoors, and in image technology.

The CIE Headquarters are in Vienna, Austria. The organization holds biennial scientific conferences to advance knowledge, publishes technical reports and standards, and liaises with related bodies including the International Committee on Weights and Measures (CIPM), the International Organization for Standardization (ISO), and the International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) to address matters of joint interest.

Light Collaboration Network for Research and Education

Light Collaboration Network – for Research and Education is a new network which has developed out of a common desire to provide opportunities for communication involving a wide audience, educational exchange and research / industry collaboration on light-related topics.

The initiators are five light researchers rooted in different disciplines and spread over four universities in Sweden. They cross boundaries between architecture, lighting design, optometry, physics and biology.

The Light Collaboration Network is thought of as an enrichment through learning from mentors, applying new knowledge by combining elements in theories, methods and concepts, and by taking a science-based approach in practice by applying what works and what doesn't.

The network shares latest news in discovery research from respective fields and bundles research/education/dissemination activities to inspire, engage and develop a mutual understanding to convey the knowledge in an effective manner.
